1. ANNOUNCEMENT / INVITATION

The Icelandic Skating Association would like to invite you to participate in the **Reykjavik International Games 2020 (RIG)**. Reykjavík International Games is a multisport event which is hosted by Reykjavik city over a two-week period. Further information about the multisport events can be found at www.rig.is

This will be the 13th year figure skating is part of the Reykjavík International Games, and the 7th year on the list of ISU competitions. With great pleasure we welcome figure skaters from ISU Member Federations to participate in this International figure skating competition.

2. GENERAL REGULATIONS

Reykjavík International Games 2020 will be conducted in accordance with the ISU Constitution and General Regulations 2018, the Special Regulations & Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018, and the relevant ISU Communications.

Participation in the **Reykjavík International Games 2020** is open to all Competitors who belong to an ISU Member, and qualify with regard to eligibility according to Rule 102, provided their ages fall within the limits specified in Rule 108, paragraph 3 b) and they meet the participation, citizenship and residency requirements in Rule 109, paragraphs 1 through 5 and ISU Communication 2030 or any update of this Communication.

In accordance with Rule 109 of the ISU General Regulations and ISU Communication 2030 all Skaters who do not have the nationality of the Member by which they have been entered or who, although having such nationality, have in the past represented another Member, must produce an ISU Clearance Certificate. **Passports of all Skaters, as well as the ISU Clearance Certificate, if applicable, must be presented at the accreditation of the event for verification.**

All competitors must be entered through their respective Member Federation.

3. TECHNICAL DATA

PLACE **Main arena (MR): Laugardalur Ice Arena**, Múlavegi 1, Reykjavík
(an indoor ice-rink with the ice surface of 30 x 60 m, air-conditioned and heated)

Practice arena (PR): same as main arena.
Some practices may be in **Egilshöll Ice Arena**, Fossaleyni 1, Reykjavík
(an indoor ice-rink with the ice surface of 30 x 60 m, air-conditioned and heated)

JUNIOR LADIES	Short Program	The required elements to be skated are those listed in ISU Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018 Rule 611, paragraphs 1 and 3 for 2019-2020. Duration: 2 min., 40 sec.
	Free Skating	In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018, Rule 612 and the respective ISU Communication. Special attention should be paid to the “well balanced program” and the element value. Duration: 3 min., 30 sec.

3.3 SENIOR CATEGORIES

SENIOR MEN	Short Program	The required elements to be skated are those listed in ISU Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2016 Rule 611, paragraphs 1 and 2 for 2019-2020. Duration: 2 min., 40 sec.
	Free Skating	In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018, Rule 612 and the respective ISU Communication. Special attention should be paid to the “well balanced program” and the element value. Duration: 4 min.
SENIOR LADIES	Short Program	The required elements to be skated are those listed in ISU Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018 Rule 611, paragraphs 1 and 2 for 2019-2020. Duration: 2 min., 40 sec.
	Free Skating	In accordance with ISU Technical Rules Single & Pair Skating 2018, Rule 612 and the respective ISU Communication. Special attention should be paid to the “well balanced program” and the element value. Duration: 4 min.

4. ENTRIES

All Entry Forms are available on the website of the competition www.iceskate.is/rig2020/. Please e-mail Entry Forms to rig@iceskate.is.

4.1 Entries of competitors

The entries by name should reach the organizer no later than **Friday, December 13th 2019**. The official entry form **RIG02** must be used and we kindly ask skaters to send a copy of their passport at the time of entry to rig@iceskate.is

Confirmation of the skaters accepted to the competition will be published on the website no later than **December 20th 2019**.

4.2 Entry fee

The entry fee for Senior, Junior and Advanced Novice is **100 €** per participant. The entry fee must be paid by **Friday, December 13th 2019** to the following bank account – we kindly ask members to make one payment transaction for all their skaters and mark it with the text “RIG2020”.

Entry fees are not refunded in case of withdrawal after **Friday, December 13th 2019**. Entry fee will be refunded if the skater is not accepted (if there will be a limitation of the numbers of entries).

4.3 Entries of officials

Each participating ISU Member is welcome to nominate a Judge and/ or Technical Specialist with at least the qualification International Judge, International Technical Controllers and International Technical Specialists. Please fill in the Judges form **RIG03** and return no later than **Friday, December 13th 2019**. The panels will be announced no later than **December 20th 2019**. The Icelandic Skating Association will make a draw to select the Judges and selection of Technical Panel will be based on the order the candidates are received, country and qualifications.

4.4 General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)¹

By entering to this event each competitor, or if a competitor is under the age of 18 their guardian, accepts the following:

1. Name of skater can be published in the list for competitors as well as starting order.
2. Results and protocols can be published online on the event website.
3. Photographs and video recordings can be made of the skater during RIG 2020
4. Footage of the skater can be published on the event website as well as the Host Federations (ÍSS) website.
5. Footage of the skater can be published on social media platforms owned by ÍSS (Host Federation)
6. Footage of the skater can be used for promotional purposes.

7. A third party, on behalf of ÍSS (Host Federation), can take pictures and video recordings of the skater.
8. Footage of the skater can be published in the media

Conditions for publication of the list of competitors and results, photographs and video recordings

1. The Icelandic Skating Association (ISS) is responsible for following Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament.
2. We will not use footage of skaters, for promotional purposes, after they retire from their athletic careers. The footage will be preserved with ISS for historical reference.
3. Personnel is not allowed to use footage for their personal use.
4. Results will be kept published online until the start of the next RIG event. They will be preserved with ISS for historical reference.
5. You can at any time revoke an approval already granted. Withdrawal of the consent does not affect the legality of the footage already in place up to that time.

5. MEALS, LODGING and TRAVEL EXPENSES

The organizer will provide and cover the expenses for room and meals for accepted judges and invited Officials participating, beginning with dinner on **Thursday, January 23rd 2020** until lunch on **Sunday, January 26th 2020**.

Should any official arrive at the hotel before or stay longer than the period described above, their room costs and expenses will be the responsibility of the individual and must be paid upon arrival. Travel expenses for drawn judges must be covered by the respective member.

All extra expenses incurred by any Official will be the responsibility of that person and must be paid prior to departure. The expenses for rooms and meals for Team Leaders, competitors and other team officials will not be covered by the organizer and are on the account of the team.

Closing Banquet

A closing banquet will be held on Sunday, January 26th 2020, which all participants can attend. Further information about prices and time schedule can be found at www.rig.is.

6. PRACTICE

Official practice for Competitors begins on **Friday, January 24th 2020**. The detailed schedule will be issued at the time of registration.

7. MUSIC / PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT

The organizer asks to receive all competition music in MP3 format via rig@iceskate.is no later than **January 10th 2020**. Please name the .mp3 file with each competitors name and program (short/free).
Ex: John Smith_Freeskate.mp3

A list of titles, composers and orchestras of the music to be used for the Short Program and Free Skating Program must be listed for each Competitor on the official **Music Selection Form RIG06**.

All competitors shall furnish extra copy of competition music of excellent quality on either CD or any other electronic means to have available at the rink during their event (playback from phones is not accepted), in accordance with ISU Rule 343, paragraph 2. Each program (short/free) must be recorded on one track respectively on a separate disc. Discs must show the competition event, competitors name, nation and the exact running time of the music (not skating time) including any starting signal.

The Program Component Sheet **RIG05** must be sent together with the music to rig@iceskate.is no later than **January 10th 2020**. The Program Component Sheet must be filled in precisely by each skater in English using the Terminology for the elements listed in the respective ISU Communication.

8. ARRIVAL OF PARTICIPANTS / TEAMS

The international airport. Keflavik Airport (KEF), is located with a distance of 40 km from the capital. Travel from the airport to Reykjavík with Fly-bus takes approx. 50 min.

The competitors, coaches and additional team officials are responsible for their own arrangements concerning ground transportation to and from the airport.

Buses are available from Keflavik airport and stop at all main hotels. Further information about the bus service can be found at www.kefairport.is/english/to-andfrom-the-airport/buses/ and www.re.is/flybus/.

Invited Officials, Referees, the Technical Panel (Technical Controller, Technical Specialists, Data & Replay Operators), Judges, Competitors, Team Leaders, Team Officials and Coaches taking part in the competition are requested to announce to the Organizing Committee as soon as possible, but no later than **January 3rd 2020**, the name of the airlines, flight numbers, dates and times of arrival at Keflavik International Airport or any other information concerning transportation and arrivals. The travel form **RIG04** should be used. **All Officials will have arranged transport from Keflavik Airport.**

9. OFFICIAL HOTEL

The Organizer will make the room arrangements for invited officials only.

All competitors, coaches and team leaders as well as team officials, medical staff and chaperones are asked to take care of their accommodation and bear their own expenses.

10. ACCREDITATION

The Accreditation is planned at the **ice rink / Laugardalur Ice Arena** upon arrival **Thursday, January 23rd from 14:00-20:00** and on **Friday, January 24th from 08:00**.

Accreditation as a Team Member will be given to all entered Judges, Competitors and one Team Leader per participating team, one Coach per competitor, two medical persons and one Team Official of ISU Members. Accreditation will only be granted to persons in those various functions if officially entered and named through their ISU Member.

Chaperons will not receive accreditation.

11. OPENING DRAW

Opening draw will take place on Thursday, January 23rd 2020.

Starting order will be made public on the official website immediately.

The order of skating in the Free Program will be in the reverse order of places in the Short Program.

12. PRESENTATION OF MEDALS

The three best placed Competitors in each event will be announced and honored. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be presented to the medalists. **Skaters with highest score (ladies and men) will be given special awards in a special RIG ceremony with athletes from other sports during the closing banquet on Sunday, January 26th.**

13. PROTOCOL / LIST OF RESULTS

The marking system (ISU Judging System) as described in ISU Technical Rule Single & Pair Skating 2018. Rule 352 and Rule 353 (Determination and publication of results) will be used.

14. INSURANCE / LIABILITY

In accordance with Rule 119, it is the sole obligation of each Member participating to provide medical and accident insurance for their athletes, officials and all other members of the Member's team. Such insurance must assure full medical attendance and also the return of the ill or injured person to the home country by air transport or by other expeditions.

15. INITIAL JUDGES MEETING/ROUND TABLE DISCUSSION

The initial Judges meeting and the Technical panel meeting will be held at the ice rink **Friday morning, January 24th**. The exact times will be announced after the practice schedule has been completed. Round Table Discussions will be held Saturday and Sunday (see schedule).
